# Depression in the elderly

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### Abstract:

Depression is the most frequent mental disorder also in the elderly population and it is often unrecognized and untreated. Compared to other age groups, there are differences in risk factors, symptomatology, comorbidity, differential diagnosis and management. In the course epidemiology and risk factors will be presented. Diagnosis will be discussed with special focus on the differential diagnosis to grief, dementia and anxiety disorders. Screening instruments will be discussed and trained. Sleep problems and suicidality will deserve special attention. Regarding therapy, relevant modifications of psychoactive drug and psychological therapies will be presented as well as sport and ECT. The management in the presence of physical disability or in special settings shall be discussed. Last but not least prevention of depression will be highlighted. Case vignettes are used.
